**ORDER TO REOPEN, NOTICE,

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This is the Order to Reopen, Notice, and Request for Comments in docket 2400-ER-105.

The Commission reopens this docket to correct errors in the Final Decision issued in this proceeding on August 14, 2014 (Final Decision). ([PSC REF#: 213897.](#))

Schedule CTC-1, Commitment to Community Program Rider of Gresham Municipal Light and Power Utility's (Gresham) electric tariff, which was approved in the Final Decision, neglected to include revised fees to be collected from customers in several customer classes that were approved in the Final Decision. Gresham requested corrections to include fees that had been approved for those classes by letter dated March 25, 2020, after the error was discovered. ([PSC REF#: 386399.](#))

Schedule CTC-1 of the Final Decision should have set fees of 1.2 percent of the total electric bill for each retail electric customer in the following rate classifications: Rg-2

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Residential Service Time-of-Day, Gs-2 General Service Time-of-Day, Cp-1 Small Power Time-of-Day, and Cp-5 Interruptible Rider. These rate classes were unintentionally omitted from the schedule when the Final Decision was issued.

The Commission intends to modify the Final Decision so this correction can be made to Schedule CTC-1. A copy of the proposed revised schedule is attached to this Order to Reopen, Notice, and Request for Comments.

The Commission hereby directs Gresham to provide notice of this Order and an opportunity to comment to all affected customers. Gresham shall provide notice to all affected customers by sending each of them a copy of this Order at least 10 business days before the date that comments are due in this docket, and by making a copy of this Order available to the public at locations where customer payments are accepted, on Gresham's website, or in a form and place that is otherwise readily accessible to the public, at least 10 business days before the date that comments are due in this docket. Gresham shall also upload certification of the date of that customer notice to the Commission's Electronic Filing system (ERF).

DOCUMENTS. All documents in this docket are filed on ERF. To view these documents: (1) go to the Commission's web site at <http://apps.psc.wi.gov>, (2) enter "2790-ER-105" in the box labeled "Quick Single Docket Search," and (3) select "Documents."

COMMENTS. The Commission requests comments on the above issues. Comments are due no later than Thursday, August 13, 2020, at 4:30 p.m. Any utilities, organizations, or interest groups shall file one comment using ERF.

Any members of the general public shall file only one comment, either through the Commission's web site or by mail, as follows:

If no comments are received, the Secretary to the Commission is directed to sign on behalf of the Commission a Correction Order making the proposed changes. If comments are received, the Commission delegates authority to the Administrator of the Division of Energy Regulation and Analysis to make the decision regarding the proposed corrections.

GRESHAM ELECTRIC UTILITY

Commitment to Community Program Rider

Under provisions of 1999 Wisconsin Act 9 and 2005 Wisconsin Act 141, a municipal electric utility shall charge each customer a low-income assistance and energy efficiency fee. Fifty percent of the fees charged by the municipal utility shall be used for low-income assistance programs and the remainder will be used for energy efficiency programs. Low-income programs may include assistance to low-income households for weatherization and other energy conservation services, payment of energy bills or early identification or prevention of energy crises. Energy efficiency programs may include those programs designed to reduce the demand for natural gas or electricity or improving the efficiency of its use during any period.

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. §§ 16.957(5) and 196.374(7), each municipal electric utility must collect an average of \$16 per meter per year. The actual amount of fees paid by a customer cannot exceed the lesser of 3 percent of all other billed electric charges or \$750 per month. These fees are not subject to Gross Receipts or Sales Taxes. A municipal utility may determine the amount that a particular class of customers is required to pay and may charge different fees to different classes of customers.

Gresham Electric Utility, in compliance with these laws and, as of the "Effective Date" established below, has set the fees for each retail electric customer rate classification as follows:

Rg-1 Residential Service	1.2% of the total electric bill
Rg-2 Residential Service TOD	1.2% of the total electric bill
Gs-1 General Service	1.2% of the total electric bill
Gs-2 General Service TOD	1.2% of the total electric bill
Cp-1 Small Power Service	1.2% of the total electric bill
Cp-1 Small Power TOD	1.2% of the total electric bill
Cp-2 Large Power Service TOD	1.2% of the total electric bill
Ms-1 Street, Area, and Athletic Field Lighting Service	1.2% of the total electric bill
Cp-5 Interruptible Rider	1.2% of the total electric bill

Gresham Electric Utility has elected to send 100 percent of the low-income assistance and energy efficiency fees collected from its retail electric customers to the state of Wisconsin to participate in the State's low-income assistance and Focus on Energy programs.
