

Absentee ballot requests for the April 6, 2021 Spring Election **VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT**

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may request to vote an absentee ballot. A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen, who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day, who has resided in the ward or municipality where he or she wishes to vote for at least 28 consecutive days before the election. before an absentee ballot may be issued. The elector must also be registered in order to receive an absentee ballot. Proof of identification must be provided

You must make a request for an absentee ballot in writing or online at MyVote.wi.gov.

Voting an absentee ballot by mail

The deadline for making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail is: 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, April 1, 2021

Note: Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined to home or a care facility, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting

Voting an absentee ballot in person
You may also request and vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office or other specified location during the days and hours specified for casting an absentee ballot in person. See following list.

* The last day to vote by absentee ballot in the municipal clerk's office is FRIDAY, APRIL 2, 2021. The first day to vote by Absentee ballot in the municipal clerk's office is TUESDAY, MARCH 23, 2021.
