

Notice of Partisan Primary and Sample Ballots

August 9th. 2022

Office of County of Shawano, Village of Gresham Clerk

To the voters of Shawano County, Village of Gresham:

Notice is hereby given of a partisan primary to be held in Shawano County, Village of Gresham on Tuesday, August 9th, 2022, at which the nominees for the offices named below shall be chosen. The names of the candidates for each office, whose nominations have been certified to or filed in the office, are given under the title of the office under the appropriate party, each in its proper column, together with the questions submitted to a vote, if any in the sample ballot below.

Information to Voters

Upon entering the polling place and before being permitted to vote, a voter shall:

- state their name and address
- show an acceptable form of photo identification*
- sign the poll book**

***If a voter does not have acceptable photo identification, the voter may obtain a free photo ID for voting from the Division of Motor Vehicles.**

****If the voter is unable to sign the poll book due to disability, a poll worker may write the word "exempt."**

If a voter is not registered to vote, they may register to vote at the polling place serving their residence if the voter provides proof of residence.

Where ballots are distributed to voters, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot.

Upon being permitted to vote, the voter shall enter a voting booth or go to a machine and cast their ballot. The vote should not be cast in any manner other than specified here. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the voter in marking their ballot may be taken into the booth and copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked.

A voter who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the voter's minor child or minor ward.

An election official may inform the voter of the proper manner for casting a vote, but the official may not advise or indicated a particular voting choice.

Assistance for Voting

A voter may select an individual to assist in casting their vote if the voter declares to the presiding official that they are unable to read, have difficulty reading, writing, or understanding English, or that due to disability are unable to cast their ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the voter's employer or an agent of the employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the voter. If a voter is unable to state their name and address, an assistant may also do so for the voter.

At the partisan primary, the voter shall select the party of their choice. Voting for candidates of more than one party may invalidate the ballot. The voter must cast a vote for individual candidates.

Where Paper Ballots are used

- The voter shall choose the ballot of the party of their choice
If the voter votes on more than one party ballot no votes will be counted.

On the party ballot of their choice, the voter shall make an **(X)** or other mark in the square next to the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall write in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a writ-in vote. On referendum questions, the voter shall make and **(X)** or other mark in the square next to “yes” if in favor of the question, or the voter shall make an **(X)** or other mark in the square next to “no” if opposed to the question.

Where Touch Screen Voting is Used

The voter shall touch the screen or use the tactile pad to select the party of their choice. The voter shall then touch the screen at the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall type in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote. On referendum questions, the voter shall touch the screen at “yes” if in favor of the question or the voter shall touch the screen at “no” if opposed to the question.

Spoiled Ballots

If a voter spoils a **paper** ballot, they shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one voter. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the voter shall return it to the election official, who shall issue a proper ballot in its place.

The voter may spoil a touch screen ballot at the voting station before the ballot is cast.

After Voting the Ballot

After an official **paper** ballot is marked, it shall be folded so the inside marks do not show, but so the printed endorsements and inspector’ initials on the outside do show. The voter shall then deposit the voted ballot in the ballot box, or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit, and deposit the un-voted ballots in the discard box. The voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

After and official **touch screen** ballot is marked, the voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

Partisan Primary Ballot Selection and Marking Instructions

August 9, 2022

The Partisan Primary is a nomination process. Voting in this primary is your opportunity to express to one party of your choice which of the party's candidates you recommend for placement on the General Election ballot.

Voting in a Partisan Primary

1. Choose a party:

- You may only vote on **ONE** party's ballot. If you vote on more than one party's ballots, your votes will not count.
- ✓ Choose **ONE** party ballot on which to vote
 - ✓ Remove your selected party's ballot from the packet

2. Vote for candidates on your selected ballot:

- ✓ Voting only on the party ballot you selected, vote for one candidate per office
 - ✓ To vote for a name on the ballot, make an "X" in the square next to the name like this
 - ✓ To vote for a name that is not on the ballot, write the name on the line marked "write-in"

3. If you make a mistake or have a question:

- ✓ Ask an election inspector for help
 - ✓ **Absentee voters:** contact your municipal clerk
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4. Cast your ballot:

- ✓ When you're finished voting, place the party ballot you voted on in the ballot box
- ✓ Place the party ballots you did not vote on in the discard box
